**BULKY ITEMS**

Items that cannot properly fit in your bin, such as a chair or desk, are considered bulky items and require a special pick up. Electronic waste [e-Waste] is anything with a circuit board or battery, such as computers, telephones and small printers. White goods [e.g. refrigerators, freezers] and electronic waste cannot be disposed of in your bin. CR&R will collect and properly recycle these items. **HAZARDOUS WASTE**

Hazardous waste are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive or toxic. They are dangerous to the public and the environment. It is illegal to dispose of hazardous wastes in your CR&R containers. Hazardous wastes must be disposed of properly. # AB 341

Assembly Bill 341 [AB341] requires all businesses in California that generate 4 or more cubic yards of waste per week to recycle. Participating in a CR&R recycling program will assist your business in meeting these recycling requirements. Businesses may also donate, sell and/or self-haul materials to a recycling facility. Information about California's business recycling requirements is available from the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery [CalRecycle] at [calrecycle.ca.gov/recycle/commercial](http://calrecycle.ca.gov/recycle/commercial).

## RECYCLE PROGRAMS

### MIXED RECYCLING

This program recycles materials such as: cardboard, mixed paper, plastic, aluminum and glass bottles. They may be mixed together and placed in a recycling bin.

### SOURCE SEPARATED RECYCLING

Your business may generate a large amount of one type of recyclable material, such as cardboard. CR&R can help you determine the best container for your needs based on the quantity and type of material.

### CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION

With construction and demolition [C&D] debris making up a large percentage of all material entering California landfills, CR&R can help you to divert as much as possible through a combination of source separation and mixed processing. Prior to starting your project, contact CR&R to find out what options will work best for your site. Planning ahead will assist you in diverting as much material as possible, as cost effectively as possible.

### LEED PROGRAM

## NEW ORGANICS RECYCLING

# AB 1826

Assembly Bill 1826 [AB 1826] requires businesses to separate their organics (food scraps and yard waste) for recycling. Restaurants, super markets, large venues and food processors generate significant quantities of food waste and several states have already prohibited the disposal of this material. AB 1826 builds on the success of the mandatory commercial recycling program established by AB 341.

In order to help businesses comply with the new law, CR&R has invested in new cutting edge technology. Our Anaerobic Digester will safely and efficiently recycle all your organic materials.

Returning organic materials to the soil drastically reduces the environmental impacts of landfills, reduces greenhouse gases, creates jobs, and helps sustain California's agricultural industry.
