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**SUBJECT:** Authorization of an Emergency Bridge Loan to Palo Verde Healthcare District

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**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended Council adopt Resolution No. 2026-001 to approve a Budget Amendment in the amount of \$330,000 from FY 2025/26 budget surplus funds to provide gap funding to Palo Verde Healthcare District, approve a loan of \$330,000 to the Palo Verde Healthcare District, and authorize the Interim City Manager to execute a Loan Agreement with the Palo Verde Health Care District and all related documents for such loan in a form approved by the City Attorney.

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**FISCAL IMPACT:** \$330,000 in FY 2025/26 Budget Surplus.

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**BACKGROUND:** For months Palo Verde Hospital, which is operated under the Palo Verde Healthcare District (PVHD) and its Board of Directors, has been under threat of closure due to its dire financial situation. In May 2025, the District shuttered hospital operations except for the Emergency Room, Laboratory and Radiology. The City and County have worked with State legislators and other partners to try to aid the PVHD.

Due to a lack of faith in the current management of the District, in May the City reached out to LAFCO requesting dissolution of the Palo Verde Healthcare District. After the LAFCO meeting, the PVHD filed for Chapter 9 Bankruptcy protection.

Requests for funding have been made by the District to various partners. They have been told that money will not flow under the current leadership. The City, State and County cannot put taxpayer funds in jeopardy, and there is no confidence in the current management of Palo Verde Hospital. As such, there is no way to guarantee that any funds given will be used appropriately. Even with this information, the PVHD made no changes to the management or operation of the District or hospital. This has led to a further breakdown in communication between the City, County and District. Hospital management has been keeping everyone at arm's length.

The week of Thanksgiving, the District was required to submit roughly \$3.8 million in funding to the State to participate in the Intergovernmental Transfer (IGT) program. If they did this, they would receive a roughly \$9 million return on that investment sometime in January. The District secured a loan to make the IGT payment. We understand that the State is looking at the legality of using loan funds to participate in the IGT program. The City, through its lobbyist, reached out to the Governor's office requesting that he allow the hospital to use the loan in this manner to prevent the closure of Palo Verde Hospital.

On Thursday, January 7, 2026, the PVHD posted notice of an emergency meeting for the same day at 5:00 p.m. stating that Palo Verde Hospital would be closed as of 12:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 10, 2026, unless \$2 million was obtained. It has yet to be determined how they derived this amount and who they have asked to provide them with this funding. The District's emergency meeting agenda is attached to this staff report for more information related to the situation at the PVHD and the future of Palo Verde Hospital.

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**STAFF REPORT:** As Palo Verde Hospital is part of the Palo Verde Healthcare District, the City and County's hands are tied as to what we are legally allowed to do to assist the hospital. And to be clear, the citizens of Blythe are tired of being held hostage by the current administration. We find ourselves in the current situation due to their unwillingness to corporate with the City and County.

To keep the hospital from closing at 12:00 a.m. this Saturday, staff proposes a bridge loan to the Palo Verde Healthcare District in the amount of \$330,000. According to the County, this amount is their weekly burn rate, or the amount necessary to make payroll for one week. This will buy the District time to work through the IGT funding issues with the Sate and prevent the Saturday closure of Palo Verde Hospital.

As the City is very concerned with how these funds will be used, staff propose that these funds be contingent upon the District agreeing to bring in the County or a County approved management team to take over the day-to-day operation and management of Palo Verde Hospital. Staff believes this is the only way to bring the hospital back from the brink of closure and finally start on a path toward financial stability. This will also help rebuild the community's faith and trust in our local health care system.

Therefore, it is recommended that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2026-001 to approve a Budget Amendment in the amount of \$330,000 from FY 2025/26 budget surplus funds to provide gap funding to Palo Verde Healthcare District, approve a loan of \$330,000 to the Palo Verde Healthcare District, and authorize the Interim City Manager to execute a Loan Agreement with the Palo Verde Healthcare District and all related documents for such loan in a form approved by the City attorney.



**SUBJECT:** Palo Verde Healthcare District's Imminent Closure without IGT Funding

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**SUMMARY:**

On December 11, 2025, the Palo Verde Healthcare District ("District") funded its required contribution to participate in the Voluntary Rate Range Program for Calendar Year 2024 ("VRRP"). Absent receipt of VRRP funding from one or more managed care plans this week, the hospital faces imminent closure by Friday, January 9, 2026. At that point, the Board will be compelled to consider initiating the dissolution process, as the District has approximately 3.4 days of operating cash remaining.

- The District fully funded its intergovernmental transfer ("IGT") obligation and timely submitted all documentation requested by the California Department of Health Care Services ("DHCS"), including materials provided under extended deadlines in mid-December.
- The District is currently operating under Chapter 9 bankruptcy protection and is actively working to reorganize and restructure its debts in order to continue operations.
- As part of this effort, on December 11 the District funded its share of the State of California's Medi-Cal (Medicaid) match through IGTs administered by DHCS.
- The District used working capital—primarily a \$3.45 million working capital loan to fund its IGT obligation. DHCS has questioned the permissibility of this loan; however, the District has certified that, in its opinion, the loan is permissible.
- The District has no reason to believe that DHCS has failed to fund the managed care plans in full. Accordingly, DHCS either utilized the District's funds as intended or used State funds and is holding the District's contribution pending a determination.
- The District filed a motion in federal bankruptcy court outlining its interpretation of the statutes governing the VRRP and obtained a court order related to the loan and associated transactions.



- In the prior two years, the District funded its IGT obligations using a combination of a working line of credit from its community bank and limited cash reserves.
- IGT funds are used by DHCS, along with contributions from other providers in the managed care pool, to satisfy the State's share of the Medi-Cal match and to draw down federal Medicaid matching funds in accordance with Federal Financial Participation statutes.
- Managed care plans then return increased managed care rates to participating providers in the pool.
- IEHP and Kaiser provided initial estimates indicating approximately \$7.6 million in VRRP payments by the end of December, followed by an additional \$2.3 million from Molina in January, for a total of approximately \$9.9 million.
- The District has received no other external funding to address its financial distress.
- Cash reserves remain at approximately 3.4 days, and unpaid obligations to mission-critical vendors continue to increase, with the District unable to meet these payment obligations.
- Without immediate State action, the District will begin this week to implement emergency measures to close hospital operations in an orderly manner in coordination with the County and other regional agencies.
- The District recently learned that DHCS has not yet made a determination regarding the permissibility of using the District's operating funds to participate in the VRRP and understands that DHCS is awaiting guidance from the Governor's Office.
- The District has sought assistance from the offices of Senator Schiff, Congressman Ruiz, and Senator Padilla to support a determination that the funds are permissible under the VRRP.
- Despite the efforts of federal, state, and local representatives to preserve hospital operations, the District cannot continue without receipt of this funding, as requested and described in May.
- If VRRP funds are not received by Friday, January 9, 2026, the Board must consider initiating the dissolution process.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

1. Move that the Board of Directors of the Palo Verde Healthcare District finds that an Emergency Meeting of the Board of Directors is necessary pursuant to Government Code section 54956.5(a)(1) and (b) involving matters upon which prompt action is necessary due to the disruption or threatened disruption of public healthcare facilities.





2. Move that the Board authorize and direct the officers and professionals of the District to execute the posting and delivery of closure notices in accordance with State Law for the indefinite cessation of medical services at the Palo Verde Hospital and the community clinic on January 10, 2026, at 12:00.a.m., including refusing to admit any new patients at such time and date, and to implement an orderly closure plan for the prompt furlough of all non-essential employees, contractors, and personnel, with the closure plan to be prepared in closed session.
3. Move that the closure of the hospital may be postponed by the receipt of no less than \$2 million by January 9, 2026, at 5:00 p.m.

### **A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLYTHE, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING A BUDGET AMENDMENT OF \$330,000, APPROVING A LOAN OF \$330,000 TO THE PALO VERDE HEALTHCARE DISTRICT, AND AUTHORIZING THE INTERIM CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A LOAN AGREEMENT WITH THE PALO VERDE HEALTHCARE DISTRICT AND ALL RELATED DOCUMENTS IN A FORM APPROVED BY THE CITY ATTORNEY**

The City Council of the City of Blythe hereby finds and declares as follows:

**WHEREAS**, Palo Verde Hospital is the only hospital serving Blythe and the Palo Verde Valley. The nearest hospitals in California are in the Coachella Valley and Needles and are approximately 100 miles away; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 24, 2025, the Palo Verde Healthcare District (PVHD) Board of Directors, which manages the Palo Verde Hospital, announced that it had decided to suspend patient admissions at the hospital for the foreseeable future; and

**WHEREAS**, since May 2025, only the Emergency Department and necessary support services, such as radiology and the laboratory, remain open; and

**WHEREAS**, since May 2025, the City has been working diligently with staff from the County as well as the City's County, State, and Federal representatives to find a solution to keep the hospital open; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 7, 2025, the PVHD posted notice of an emergency meeting to be held the same day at 5:00 p.m. stating that the hospital would be closed as of 12:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 10, 2026, unless \$2 million was obtained; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to provide a bridge loan of \$330,000 to the PVHD to help the hospital remain open; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to condition the loan upon the PVHD agreeing to bring in Riverside County or a County-approved management team to take over the day-to-day operation and management of Palo Verde Hospital; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 10, 2025, the City Council of the City of Blythe adopted Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Operating and Capital Budget by Resolution No. 2025-010; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to amend the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Operating and Capital Budget.

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLYTHE, CALIFORNIA DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1.** The City Council hereby approves amendments to the 2025-2026 Operating and Capital Budget: revenue, expenditure, and transfers, as summarized in Exhibit A to this resolution.

**SECTION 2.** The City Council hereby approves a loan of \$330,000 to the Palo Verde Healthcare District, conditioned upon the Palo Verde Healthcare District agreeing to bring in Riverside County or a County-approved management team to take over the day-to-day operation and management of Palo Verde Hospital.

**SECTION.** The City Council hereby authorizes the Interim City Manager to execute a loan agreement with the Palo Verde Healthcare District and all related documents in a form approved by the City Attorney.

**SECTION 4.** The City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the file of original resolutions.
